Quinquagesima Sunday

*Jesus said to him, "Receive thy sight, thy faith has saved thee" (GOSPEL).
 "We are going up to Jerusalem," city of His Great Sacrifice, during Lent.
 His intimate followers were spiritually blind to the need of a Good Friday.*

*To strengthen the weak faith of His disciples, He rewards the strong
 "faith" of the "blind man." Faith is needed to "see" the need of Lenten
 penance – faith which lives by love: love for God, love for neighbor
 (EPISTLE). Where there is love, there is no labor; but if there is labor, it is
 loved. The INTROIT, PRAYER and GRADUAL inspire us with confidence
 as we too, "go up" with faith (OFFERTORY) and charity (COMMUNION
 VERSE).*
